
## Pvt Larry Mitsuru Ochiae March 30, 1915 - June 24, 1942



Larry M. Ochiae was born in Mountain View, Hawaii, on March 30, 1915. He was the son of Zensaku and Wasa (Kikugawa) Ochiae. He was educated at Olaa Elementary School, Hilo High School, Hawaii. Before entering the service, he was a clerk.

In November 14, 1941, he was inducted into the Army at Schofield Barracks, Oahu (Serial No. 30102273). He trained at Schofield Barracks, Oahu; Maui; Camp McCoy, Wisconsin. He served with the 299<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment and the 100<sup>th</sup> Infantry Battalion, Medical Company, in the Hawaiian Islands and the continental United States. He was awarded the Asiatic-Pacific Campaign Medal and World War II Victory Medal.
